# 2007 EDRA/*Places* Awards

Six exemplary projects were named winners of Environmental Design Research Association/*Places* Awards in 2007. The awards recognize distinguished work in three areas: Place Design (completed projects that demonstrate excellence as human environments); Place Planning (projects that make proposals for the future design, use, or management of a place); and Place Research (projects that investigate the relationship between design and human behavior, culture, or experience).

The EDRA/*Places* Awards are unique among programs that recognize professional and scholarly excellence in environmental design. They are distinguished by their interdisciplinary focus, concern for human factors in the design of the built environment, and commitment to promoting links between design research and practice.

The awards for 2007 were presented May 30 at EDRA's 33rd annual meeting, in Sacramento, CA. Judging of submissions took place February 24-25, 2007 at the Herberger Center for Design Research, at Arizona State University. *Places* and EDRA would like to thank ASU for sponsoring the event, especially Janet Holston of the Herberger Center, and Professor Sherry Ahrentszen and Dean Duke Reiter of the College of Design.
